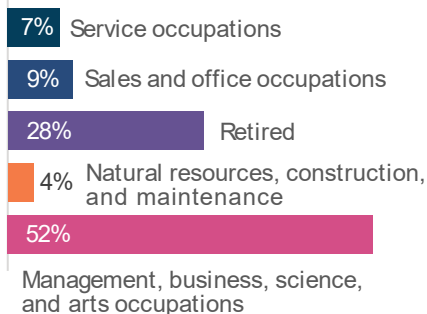
2. how many years have you lived in the centre region?



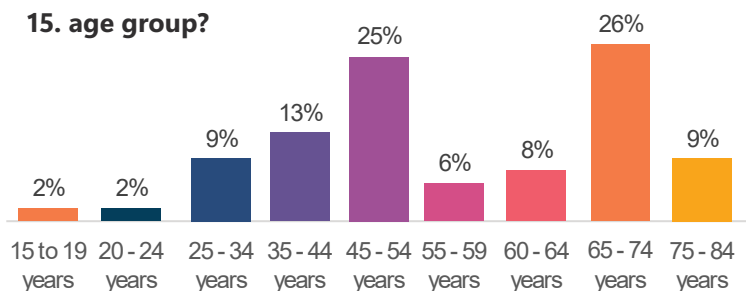

21. do you feel you need more of the following types of land uses within 10 miles from your residence?



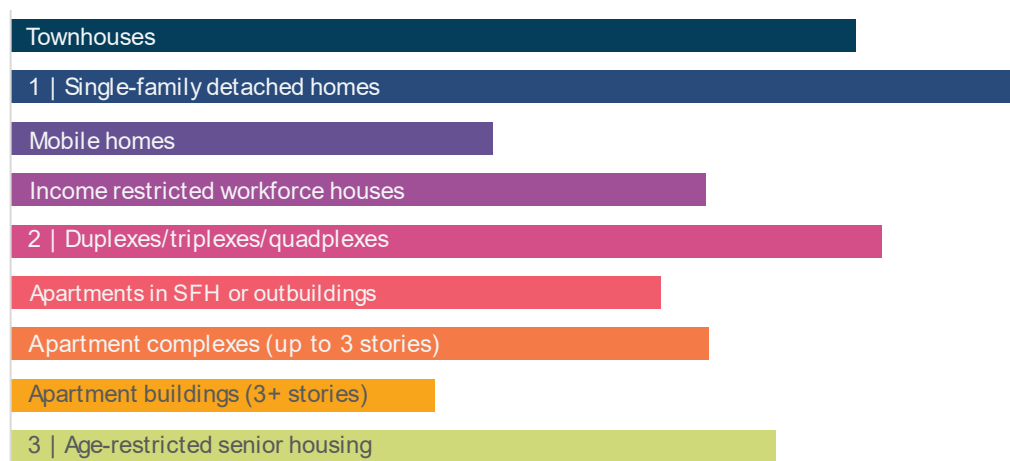

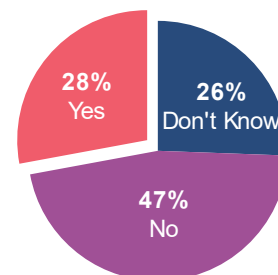

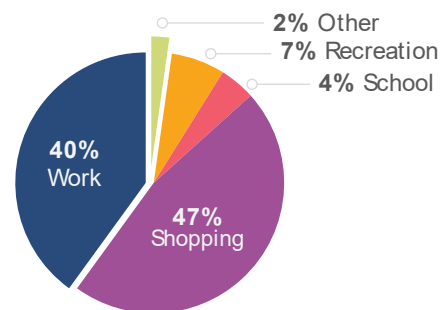
